Cross the “always open” door to Braga

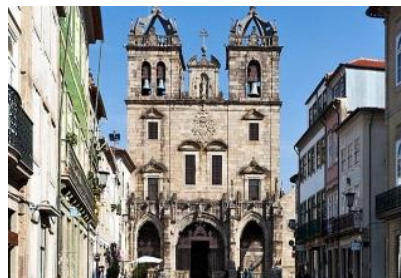
This monument is the reason why Braga is known as the city with the doors always open, since the actual door was never there and the entrance was always available. And look up: there is a woman sculpture on top of the arch that represents the city of Braga.

See the oldest Cathedral in Portugal

In the Treasure-Museum of Braga Cathedral is the cross that was used in the first mass celebrated in Brasil. Pedro Álvares Cabral took it with him and now you can admire this historical piece of art at this site.

See the most beautiful fountain in Portugal

The old Paço Episcopal has different and unmissable spots: Start with the Paço Square, see the amazing fountain; then contour the buildings to your left and you will find the beautiful Santa Bárbara Garden.

There are 581 steps to get to Bom Jesus do Monte Sanctuary. Despite the beauty of the staircase, we advise you to go up on the funicular and come down through the stairs. It will be easier and you can still enjoy the different perspectives. Before going down the stairs, be sure to admire the amazing view!
